Fire Hazards		<i>Combustible/flammable material kept to a minimum and segregated from sources of ignition.</i>

Live Stock		<i>Livestock fully restrained by appropriate devices at all times.</i>

Plant & Machinery		<i>Licensed, experienced and competent operators only to Operate plant/machinery.</i>				
		<i>Speed limits and load restrictions adhered to.</i>				
All machinery and equipment Demonstrations.		<i>Safety provisions and supervision in place when backing plant & machinery.</i>				
		<i>Engine switched off and keys removed when unattended.</i>

- For the safety of the Rotary FNQ Field Days visitors and exhibitors, vehicles movements are only allowed before 8.30am Wednesday and after 4pm on Friday. Vehicle access within the Field Days site during these times must be approved by the Field Day's Committee
- Additional site-specific hazards not outlined above must be identified, risks assessed and appropriate risk control measures implemented
